 K andy weston is one of the great modern Jazz improvisers, a direct heir to the legacy of Duke Ellington and Thelonius Monk, Born. and raised in Brooklyn, mentored by Max Roach, Monk, Duke Jordan and other greats of the bebop era, Weston's professional piano career began in the late 1940s. By the mid-'50s, he'd composed and recorded HI-Flu and Little Niles, now classics of the jazz repertoire. During that era, he also met trombonist Melba Liston who arranged many of Weston's brilliant orchestral albums over the next four decades.

Randy Weston first visited Nigeria in the early 1960s and by the end of the decade had established a home in Morocco, where he learned from and recorded with the Master Gnawa Musicians of that country. The 76-year-old planist now divides his time between Africa, Brooklyn and touring in the US and Europe.

Manu of his albums evoke different parts of Africa and the healing spirit of African music. His latest album, Ancient Future, reveals the wisdom of the ancient world where music was not viewed as entertainment, but as a vital and healing life force. Don't miss this rare opportunity to witness an intimate solo concert by one of the greatest musicians and composers of our time.

Jackie McLean featured guest with The Cedar Walton Trio

HE ENORMOUSLY INFLUENTIAL ALTO SAXOPHONIST Jackie McLean is one of the few musicians whose distinctive fone is recognizable within the first few notes. Jackie started on alto at age 15, mentored by his NYO neighbors Bud Powell, Thelonius Monk and Sonny Rollins. His debut recording was with Miles Davis in 1951; he went on to contribute to the bands of Charles Mingus and Art Blakey. From the late 1950s through the early 1960s, McLean recorded 21 classic disks for Blue Note Records. Following a long-hiatus, Blue Note again began recording his unique McLean sound in 1996. After 30 years of teaching at the University of Hartford's Hartt School of Music, Mr. McLean's decision to spend more time spreading his music throughout the world is Healdsburg's good fortune.

A week with the Cedar Walton Irio at Yoshi's last November affirmed that McLean and Walton are both at the height of their very considerable powers. Planist Cedar Walton, who headlined the first Healdsburg Jazz festival, will again display his brilliant aptitude for consistent invention, wit and passion, while swinging like mad. A composer whose tunes have achieved the status of jazz standards, Mr. Walton has played on hundreds of recordings, many with the late Billy Higgins.

Originally from Trinidad, bassist David Williams has impeccable credits that include playing with musicians as diverse as Roberta Flack, Abbey Lincoln, Ornette Coleman and Elvin Jones. A longtime member of the Cedar Walton Irio, he is one of the most squaht-after bassists in jazz today.

Drummer Albert "Tootie" Heath, who graced last year's Festival with the Heath Brothers, returns to Healdsburg to round out this stellar trio. Tootie's drumming can be heard on countless recordings — from the Modern Jazz Quartet to John Coltrane, Dexter Gordon, Yusef Lateef, Herbie Hancock and Jessica Williams.


A SUPERB JAZZ TROMBONIST AND BANDLEADER, Curtis Fuller launched his legandary career in the early 1950s playing in an army band led by Cannonball Adderly. He has played with Kenny Burrell, Yusef Lateef, Bud Powell and John Coltrane. A featured performer with Art Blakey's Jazz Messengers from 1961 through 1964, Fuller's freelance career since then has included working with Dizzy Gillesple, Count Basie, Quincy Jones and Gil Evans, Benny Golson's Jazztet and the Timeless All Stars.

Curtis Fuller's Super Band bristles with cross-generational energy. Drummer Louis Hayes, Fuller's contemporary from Detroit, is an alumnus of the bands of Yusef Lateef, Cannonball Adderly, Horace Silver and Oscar Peterson, and has appeared on records with everyone from John Coltrane and Cecil Taylor to McCoy Tyner, Freddie Hubbard and Dexter Gordon. Planist James Williams came to prominence with Art Blakey's Jazz Messengers in the late 1970s and has been in demand by such notables as Wondy Shaw, Art Farmer, Clark Terry and Sonny Stitt ever since. Michael Bowie has been the bassist of choice for divas Abbeğ Lincoln and Betty Carter. The very fine young tenor saxophonist Javon Jackson was with the last version of the lazz Messengers (1987–90) and has since been helping to keep Blakey's vision and the sound of hard-bop alive and well.



WHEN 12-YEAR-OLD JULIAN LAGE sat in with Charles Lloyd and Billig Higgins and held his own with seasoned guitarist John Abertrombie at the 2000 Healdsburg Jazz Festival, the secret was out. Lage is "a gifted young guitarist... who plays with uncanny maturity, a fluid improviser whose invention and feeling would be remarkable in an artist any age." (Jesse Hamlin, SF Chronicle) Julian, now 14 and seasoned by performances at the Monterey and SF jazz festivals and by appearances with Herbie Hancock, Charles Lloyd, Gary Burton and Carlos Santana, will kick off Saturday's triple bill with a group of exciting young Bay Area musicians: Art Hirahara on plano/keyboards, Todd Sickafoose on bass and Alan U'Ren on drums.

has been a central figure in the Bay Area jazz scene since the 1970s. His richly varied career includes musical collaborations with McCoy Typer, Stan Betz and Joe Henderson, to name a few. Lea's recent Ubiquity album March of the Jazz Guerillas, featuring saxophonist. Richard Howell and trombonist Angela Wellman, has received accolades such as "Not since Mingus and Blakey have we heard music that bristles with a sense of message like this" from Downbeut magazine. No stranger to Healdsburg, he's performed and led Jazz-Week in the Schools for two years. A free performance in the Healdsburg Plaza of the Babatunde Lea Quintet and Operation Jazz Band (with Healdsburg 5th graders) is the perfect cap to yet another historic Healdsburg Jazz Festival.

About the outdoor venues Concerts go on rain or shine. Doors open one hour before scheduled show times. Children under 10 are free at the outdoor events.
