





Celebrating Juneteenth with a jazz jubilee, the Festival brings a talent-packed triple bill to the Plaza headlined by trombone master Steve Turre, this year's artist in residence. Instantly recognizable from his almost four-decade tenure in the Saturday Night Live band, Turre gained early attention performing and recording with reed legend Rahsaan Roland Kirk and trumpet great Woody Shaw before earning renown as a prolific bandleader (and pioneer of the conch shells in jazz). The Juneteenth program also features Person2Person, a quintet co-led by tenor sax titan Houston Person and his younger colleague, fiery altoist Eric Person, and pianist Darrell Grant and the MJNEW, a band that honors and extends the elegant legacy of the Modern Jazz Quartet. With three stellar bands, the Juneteenth program exemplifies the power of music as a liberational force.

Current Resident Artistic Director for SF Jazz, Howard Wiley returns to the Festival with his soul-charged quartet, a potent combo that blends jazz, gospel, and funk with state-of-the-art grooves. A commanding improviser, Wiley has earned national and international renown, recording and performing with an array of heavyweights including Clarence "Gatemouth" Brown, Miss Lauryn Hill, Kamasi Washington, Miles Mosley, Sheila E, Cory Henry, Christian McBride, Jason Moran, and Hammond B-3 organ greats Chester Thompson and Doug Carn.

His quartet features organist LJ Holoman, a soughtafter studio player with recording credits that include Mary J. Blige, 50 Cent, Busta Rhymes, Nas, and The Game, and Fantastic Negrito; bassist/producer and multi- instrumentalist Clark Sims, also known as 'The Funk Father'; and drummer Dante "Taz" Roberson. The band will be joined by special quest, MC/rapper/vocalist **Kev Choice.**

By any measure this is a golden age when it comes to women jazz vocalists, and the most extraordinary young singer to emerge this decade is 24-year-old Samara Joy, winner of the 2023 Grammy Awards for Best New Artist and Best Jazz Vocal Album (she picked up a third Grammy in February for Best Jazz Performance). Impressive as they are, awards don't begin to tell the story of this voluptuously talented artist. With a voice as warm and plush as crushed velvet and a deeply informed repertoire of under-covered jazz tunes and American Songbook gems, she's an enthralling performer still marveling at her sudden international stature. Even as she holds the stage with maturity and self-possession, Joy is growing by leaps and bounds. The power of her music flows not so much from her bountiful virtuosity as from the open-hearted soul, which has drawn listeners from far beyond jazz's usual precincts. More than a creative force, she's a generational talent who has reached a young audience with viral TikTok videos. Embodying jazz's ability to constantly renew itself, Joy is an era-defining artist who offers a glimpse at jazz's future with each performance.

Cuban piano maestro Omar Sosa, a longtime Healdsburg favorite, returns to town with his **Quarteto Americanos** featuring Cuban bassist **Ernesto Mazar Kindelán**, Berkeley drummer Josh Jones, and Oakland multi-reed player **Sheldon Brown**, who's spent much of the past two years touring with the Grateful Dead's Bob Weir. Though long based in Barcelona, Sosa gained fame while living in Oakland, and his musical journey from Camagüey and Havana to Ecuador and eventually the East Bay is detailed in the new documentary Omar Sosa's 88 Well-**Tuned Drums**, which screens as part of this program. An omnivorously creative figure whose music encompasses Afro-Cuban folkloric chants and European Romanticism, post-bop and hip hop, West African grooves and ambient moods, he's released more than three dozen albums documenting collaborations with an international cast of fellow sound explorers.



On a scene brimming with brilliant young women vocalists, **Jazzmeia Horn** stands out as an artist determined to define herself on her own terms. Beyond her riveting stage presence and vocal prowess, she's a savvy songwriter, imaginative arranger, and commanding bandleader who has steadily expanded her repertoire with original

material. Regal and down to earth, the Dallas native has been racking up prestigious awards over the past decade, including first place at the 2013 Sarah Vaughan International Jazz Vocal Competition and top honors at the Thelonious Monk Institute International Jazz Competition in 2015. The Monk Competition triumph included a record deal and her supremely confident 2017 debut album A Social Call, which was nominated for a Grammy Award and voted the best jazz vocal debut in the NPR Music Jazz Critics Poll. The fact that she's such a standout talent is particularly impressive given that she's part of a wave of brilliant young women who've revitalized the art form.

For this concert, she's rejoining forces with the **Marcus Shelby Orchestra**. Horn and the bassist and Festival

Artistic Director first worked together at San Jose Jazz's

Winter Fest last year. Shelby has worked with many of
jazz's greatest singers, from Mary Stallings and Faye Carol
to Kim Nalley and Tiffany Austin. He came away from the
concert with Horn convinced that the music's future was
in wise, knowing hands. "In every generation there are
artists who step into those spaces, who show ingenuity as
a practitioner," Shelby says. "To me it's like Nina Simone
and how she used her voice and instrument. I'm not saying
Jazzmeia is Nina Simone. I'm saying she's stepped into
that space in a very powerful, personal way."

For the first time since becoming Healdsburg Jazz's new Artistic Director in 2020, **Marcus Shelby** will perform at the Festival with his Orchestra, a big band comprised of some of the Bay Area's most respected and well-known instrumentalists. In many ways, Shelby has turned his orchestra into an exemplar of the kind of equitable society

he advocates for off the bandstand. For his inaugural Healdsburg Jazz Festival performance, his orchestra will perform original music composed by Shelby from various suites written over the past 20 years, including music from his baseball tribute "Black Ball: The Negro Leagues and the Blues", his reflections on the pandemic "Variations on a Variant" and music by Duke Ellington honoring his 125th anniversary year.

The Marcus Shelby Orchestra will perform the first set featuring original compositions and music by Duke Ellington. The second set will feature internationally renowned vocalist Jazzmeia Horn and her big band suite that she composed and arranged titled "Dear Love". Tenor saxophonist Howard Wiley will be a special guest soloist.

At first glance trombonist/vocalist Natalie Cressman and quitarist/vocalist lan Faquini make for an unlikely duo. But within a few seconds of hearing their lustrous harmonies and graceful interplay the magic of their chemistry is readily apparent. Built on their deep knowledge of jazz and the Brazilian songbook-Faguini was born in the capital Brasilia and moved to Berkeley as an teenager and Cressman hails from an illustrious musical clan known for collaborations with some of Brazil's greatest musicians-their musical partnership has earned international acclaim over the past five years. The duo's repertoire encompasses jazz standards, classics from the American and Brazilian songbooks, and sophisticated original songs including their acclaimed second album Auburn Whisper. Written and recorded during the dark days of 2020, Auburn Whisper finds the two artists exploring a series of luxuriant soundscapes, reflecting on people and places they missed while discovering joy in the present moment. Their third album, Guinga is a tribute to the legendary Brazilian composer, guitarist and vocalist, who has mentored Faguini for more than a decade. The album was released in April. Natalie has also been touring with the Trey Anastasio Band.

Hailing from a storied New Orleans musical dynasty, trumpeter **Chief Adjuah** has fully embraced his world-shaking heritage. Formerly known as **Christian Scott**, he's a masterly improviser, stylistically venturesome composer, and far-seeing conceptualist whose improvisation-laced sound is deeply inspired by West African forms. The grandson of legendary Big Chief Donald Harrison Sr., a leader of the Mardi Gras Indians whose knowledge of Black New Orleans culture was unrivaled, and nephew of alto saxophone jazz innovator and NEA Jazz Master Big Chief Donald Harrison Jr., Chief Adjuah is steeped in jazz history and tradition. Over the past decade he's explored astonishingly beautiful new realms of African-inspired sound, what he calls "Stretch Music," while also designing and playing several ground-

breaking new harp-like instruments, the Adjuah's Bow and Adjuah's N'Goni. In the New Orleans tradition, he approaches jazz as inextricably bound to a capacious continuum of social and ritual music, a sound and sensibility that has attracted artists such as Prince, Thom Yorke, McCoy Tyner, Marcus Miller, Eddie Palmieri, and Mos Def (who've all featured him on projects). As much as any artist in jazz, he represents the music's power to uplift people, transmitting essential values via rhythmic alchemy and melodic invention.

The band will feature **Chief Adjuah**, trumpet & harp; **Morgan Guerin**, multi-instrumentalist; **Cecil Alexander**, guitar; **Ryoma Takenaga**, bass; **Weedie Braimah**, percussion; **Elé Howell**, drums.

Highlighting the way the jazz world is often undergirded by familial connections, the double bill also features The Cookers, a band that was born 20 years ago at the Healdsburg Jazz Festival. An all-star group that has performed hundreds of gigs around the world and recorded six acclaimed albums, the band is built upon a protean rhythm section with bass maestro Cecil McBee, beloved piano master George Cables, and drummer Billy **Hart**, a longtime member of the Healdsburg Festival family and NEA Jazz Master. The horns are equally formidable, with tenor sax titan Craig Handy and trumpet great **Eddie Henderson**, who gave up the practice of medicine to focus on music full time (he's the subject of a new documentary Dr. Eddie Henderson: Uncommon Genius). As the band's senior core, the five players have been in jazz's vanguard since the 1960s and over the years their paths have crossed on dozens of era-defining recordings and bands. New Orleans alto saxophonist Donald Harrison Jr. an NEA Jazz Master and Chief Adjuah's uncle, is a

revered jazz artist and educator. The band's youngest member, 59-year-old trumpeter **David Weiss**, is also the chief who first assembled the group for a concert at the 2007 Healdsburg Jazz Festival. A respected arranger who leads several other ensembles, he wanted to create a showcase for veteran masters with significant portfolios of compositions. With every ingredient of the highest quality, The Cookers serve up an aural feast unrivaled by any seven-piece band in the business.



Ambrose Akinmusire is obsessed with beauty. The trumpeter, composer and ever-evolving curator of new sounds is known for exploring new sonic frontiers, and his Owl Song trio has become one of his primary vehicles for investigation. Featuring guitar legend and Healdsburg stalwart Bill Frisell and New Orleans drum poet Herlin Riley, the stripped down ensemble ranges across the broad expanse of American music, providing an intimate setting for conversations with Frisell, a musician who's helped shape his vision. "What I love about Bill is his curiosity," Akinmusire says. "He's one of my role models. He's still questioning and pushing." A standout player since his years at Berkeley High, Akinmusire has distinguished himself at every step, from winning the

Thelonious Monk International Trumpet Competition in 2007 to delivering critically hailed commissioned works for the world's most august stages, including the Monterey Jazz Festival, the Berlin Jazz Festival, the Kennedy Center, and MassMOCA. Long enthralled with Frisell's music, he sought out several opportunities to collaborate over the years as a duo, starting in 2014 when Akinmusire was artist-in-residence at the Montreal International Jazz Festival. A few weeks before the pandemic first shut down New York City, he and Frisell did a four-night duo run at the Blue Note, "playing some of my tunes and some of his," Akinmusire says. "It was just an excuse to create and explore together." They added Riley into the mix in 2022, debuting Owl Song at the SFJAZZ Center. One of two albums he released last year on Nonesuch (the other was Beauty Is Enough, a striking solo trumpet session), Owl Song earned glowing reviews, and the music has taken startling new shapes since the recording. Don't miss this singular ensemble, a group that knows how to make silence whisper, ring, and resound.



Joining Owl Song on a magnificent double bill is a trio of a very different feather. Harpist **Brandee Younger** is a rapidly rising star who honors and extends the legacy of her pioneering predecessors Dorothy Ashby and Alice Coltrane at each performance. She's a thrilling improviser and savvy sound designer who thrives in acoustic and electric settings. In 2022, she made history by becoming the first Black woman to be nominated for a Grammy Award for Best Instrumental Composition. Beyond jazz, she's collaborated with cultural icons such as Common, Lauryn Hill, John Legend, and Moses Sumney. The trio

It's the latest venturesome encounter for Fischer, who has emerged over the past decade as one of the most powerful vocalists in the world. The Brooklyn native was already a highly sought after background singer when she scored a chart-topping R&B hit, "How Can I Ease the Pain," and a Grammy Award for Best Female R&B Vocal Performance with her 1991 debut album So Intense. Ultimately she decided to focus on her thriving career touring with the world's biggest acts, including the Rolling Stones, Luther Vandross, Sting, and Tina Turner. But in the wake of the Academy Award-winning 2013 documentary 20 Feet From Stardom, which gave prominent play to her essential vocal work, she decided to take the reins of her own career. She and Eigsti, the Grammy Award-winning pianist who has performed at the Festival with vocalist Gretchen Parlato and Sonoma County-bred guitar star Julian Lage, have been working together since 2018 as a duo. The initial concept involved developing a repertoire of hit song that she sang on, creating settings that allowed plenty of space for improvisational interplay and extended detours.

She's also become an essential muse to San Francisco choreographer Alonzo King, creating scores for and performing on stage with his LINES Ballet company numerous times over the past five years, including recent performances at the Kennedy Center and Lincoln Center. For tonight's performance with Adji Cissoko and Shuaib Elhassan, two sensational dancers who both joined LINES in 2014, Fischer is drawing partly on the score she created for King's "Deep River" with pianist Jason Moran, as well other works. For New York-raised Elhassan and German-Senegalese Cissoko, who've been encouraged by King to stretch their improvisational wings, it's an opportunity to respond directly to the music making in real time with musicians who live in the moment.

Underwritten by Healdsburg Jazz Patron Dan Carroll & Stasia Obremskey There's an early moment on Joshua Redman's 2023 album where are we that seems to open up a quietly astonishing landscape where the Berkeley saxophonist has never ventured before. The release is his first collaboration with a vocalist, captivating newcomer Gabrielle Cavassa, and his debut on his new label, the storied Blue Note Records. If the lack of capitals in the concept album's title feels like a feint at modesty, the project's scope speaks to Redman's ambition. Formatted like a double LP, where we are takes an emotional x-ray of the nation via an expansive reimagining of the American songbook, city by city. The song that first seizes the imagination is a mashup of the swaggering Count Basie classic "Going To Chicago Blues" with a interpolated motif from singer/songwriter Sufjan Stevens' "Chicago." With Cavassa's beguiling blend of old-soul emotional vulnerability, legato phrasing, and cashmere-textured



tone she coaxes Redman into luxuriant balladry. Forged during the first two years of pandemic via email, text and Zoom sessions, Redman's relationship with Cavassa didn't take on an in-person dimension until they started recording the album. In making his first major foray with a vocalist, he singled out a young artist just starting to introduce herself to the scene.

It's intriguing that her early steps echo the route that turned Redman into a star. He famously catapulted into international visibility by taking first place at the 1991 Thelonious Monk International Saxophone Competition. Cavassa, who now lives in New Orleans and spent her formative years studying jazz at San Francisco State and the sadly defunct Club Deluxe in the Haight, shared first place at the 9th Annual Sarah Vaughan International Vocal Competition in 2021. Redman notes that with the rise of Jazzmeia Horn, Veronica Swift and Samara Joy (a finalist at the 2021 Vaughan competition), "it's becoming a golden age for younger jazz vocalists," Redman said. "I mean, female jazz vocalists are on fire." What instantly attracted him to Cavassa's voice was the "intimacy and vulnerability in her expression," he says. "There's something about her sense of melody and phrasing, the texture and mood she evokes. There's an emotional intimacy in her sound, and a rawness and directness too."
