Join us for an intimate evening of live jazz, fine food, excellent wines, community, and friendship as we recall and honor Harlem of the West and the thriving creative San Francisco jazz scene it nurtured.

Before re-development in the 1950s and '60s swept away one of San Francisco's vibrant African American neighborhoods, the Fillmore District boasted a music scene known across the country as the Harlem of the West. Tonight, the Gala celebrates the Fillmore's glorious legacy and some of the legendary musicians who came of age performing on the neighborhood's stages. Among them were stellar San Francisco-based performers saxophonist/composer John Handy and vocalists Mary Stallings, Sugar Pie DeSanto, and Denise Perrier, and many other jazz stars, including club owner, historian, and radio disc jockey Sonny Buxton, who continued the legacy of Harlem of the West with his various clubs including Milestones, Jazz at Pearls, and his radio show on KCSM.

The evening starts with a VIP Reception and the **Healdsburg Jazz Student Ensemble** including **Kennedy Shelby** (vocals), **Morgan Piper Cordova** (keyboard), **Spencer Metela** (bass), and **Patrick Sullivan** (drums), will play during the VIP reception. Then guests will enjoy a multi-course dinner paired with some of our best local wines while honoring Blues great Charlie Musselwhite and his wife, Henri, both longtime Sonoma County residents.

We'll dine al fresco to the music of **Stella Heath** and the **Harlem of the West All-Stars Band**. Evoking the Fillmore's fervently creative scene, Stella Heath's band includes **Stella** (vocals – pictured above), and **Terrence Brewer** (guitar), **James Mahone** (sax), **Marcus Shelby** (bass), and **Sylvia Cuenca** (drums).

Also on hand will be UC Santa Cruz professor emeritus **Lewis Watts**, co-author of the recently reissued, expanded book *Harlem of the West*, documenting the look, feel, and sound of the Fillmore.

BARBARY COAST DINNER SHOW AT SPONSOR HOTEL HEALDSBURG

Join us for an unforgettable Barbary Coast Dinner Show at the Hotel Healdsburg's Garden Courtyard, celebrating San Francisco's storied Gold Rush era and exploring the early 20th century rise of jazz.

The evening will feature the music of Katie and the Lost Boys, with Katie Cavera, renowned for banjo and guitar, Clint Baker on trombone/clarinet, Marc Caparone on cornet, Sam Rocha on string bass/tuba, and Riley Baker on drums. In addition, enjoy a storytelling host, themed cocktails, and a delectable menu from the chefs at the Dry Creek Kitchen. The musical universe known as jazz was still coalescing in the first decade of the 20th century when musicians from New Orleans found employment in the nightclubs, dance halls, and dives on San Francisco's notoriously rowdy Barbary Coast (now North Beach and Chinatown). This hot, rhythmically charged new style gained a foothold in Baghdad by the Bay's red-light district, and New Orleans-style jazz has maintained an avid following in the region ever since. The history of Barbary by the Bay contains many overlooked stories of trailblazers, freedom fighters, and colorful characters from diverse backgrounds and communities that will be narrated by Healdsburg's own council member, actress, musician, and dancer Skylaer Palacios, who will

Vocalist and multi-instrumentalist **Katie Cavera** has been a leading force tending those trad jazz roots in recent decades. Her stomping Lost Boys combo features the equally formidable multi-instrumentalist **Clint Bake**r, another Master of Jazz's pre-swing idioms.

More than a concert, this dinner show incorporates colorful accounts of the Barbary Coast from the Gold Rush through the 1920s.



Actor, filmmaker, radio personality, and comedian **Donald Lacy**, whose work setting up the stage for musicians over several decades earned him a spot in the Bay Area Blues Society's Hall of Fame, will open our Juneteenth evening concerts with a brief set and serve as emcee for our powerhouse double bill.

MJ's Brass Boppers will heat up the stage with a set of hard-driving Crescent City funk 'n' jazz. Featuring a cadre of New Orleans transplants, the Bay Area combo has earned a devoted following with irresistibly syncopated sets.

MJ's Brass Boppers Brass Band is an authentic New Orleans singing and swinging Second Line brass band fusing traditional NOLA standards, funk, jazz, modern pop & more with a second line twist!

The Dynamic Miss Faye Carol and her trio: A Bay Area mainstay for more than five decades, The Dynamic Miss Faye Carol can croon soul and standards, scat hurtling bebop lines, and deliver torch songs with scorching intensity, but everything she does is steeped in the blues. Miss Carol and her trio will present a special Juneteenth performance featuring compositions that span the history of black music including Spirituals, Blues, Swing, Rhythm and Blues, Pop, and Hip Hop. Award-winning vocalist Faye Carol's trio features her music director and pianist Joe Warner, bassist Yafeu Tyhimba, and acclaimed drummer Marvin "Smitty" Smith, who has toured with Sting, Dave Holland, Sonny Rollins, Willie Nelson, and Steve Coleman. He is a former member of The New York Jazz Quartet, and he was the drummer for the Tonight Show with Jay Leno band.

Originally from San Francisco, **Tongo Eisen-Martin** is a poet, movement worker, and educator. His latest curriculum on extrajudicial killing of Black people, "We Charge Genocide Again," has been used as an educational and organizing tool throughout the country. His book titled *Someone's Dead Already* was nominated for a California Book Award. His latest book, *Heaven Is All Goodbyes*, was published by the City Lights Pocket Poets series, was shortlisted for the Griffins Poetry Prize and won a California Book Award and an American Book Award. He is San Francisco's eighth Poet Laureate.

Oakland tenor saxophonist **Howard Wiley** plays the late set with his trio, including **Aneesa Strings** (bass), and **Tony Austin** (drums). A commanding improviser, he's earned national renowned recording and performing with an array of heavyweights, including Clarence "Gatemouth" Brown, Lauryn Hill, Hammond B-3 organ greats Chester Thompson and Doug Carn, and Miles Mosley & The West Coast Get Down.

Tammy L. Hall, Healdsburg Jazz Festival Artist-in-Residence is a world-class pianist and composer whose music is representative of the entire breadth of Black American Music from its spiritual roots to modern approaches to blues, ballads, and swing. A pianist of exceptional range and talent, Healdsburg jazz is thrilled to have the Tammy L. Hall Trio open the closing concert featuring Tammy L. Hall on piano, **Kevin Goldberg** on bass, and **Deszon Claiborne** on drums.

Long before earning a Grammy Award nomination for his 2020 album What's the Hurry Bay Area, vocalist Kenny Washington was revered by his peers as one of the most exciting and talented male vocalists in jazz. Wynton Marsalis tapped Washington for the Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra's 2013 reprise of the trumpeter's Pulitzer Prize-winning oratorio about slavery, Blood on the Fields. New York vibraphonist Joe Locke crafted an exquisite set of arrangements to feature Washington's captivating voice on his critically hailed album For the Love of You. And bassist/composer Marcus Shelby built his spiritually charged album Soul of the Movement: Meditations on Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. around Washington and Faye Carol. A New Orleans native, Washington grew up in the Ninth Ward and got his start singing as a young teenager in his church's junior gospel choir. The church still resounds in his voice, along with his love of Ella Fitzgerald, Mel Tormé, and Stevie Wonder. For this Father's Day concert, he's joined by a mother of a rhythm section, the same combo that accompanied him on What's the Hurry: pianist Josh Nelson, one of L.A.'s most sought-after accompanists, bassist Gary Brown, and drummer Lorca Hart.
