DINNER & DESSERT SHOWS OPENING NIGHT



The festival kicks off with a ravishing artist in a glamorous setting when jazz vocal star Tiffany Austin brings her soulful sound to the Garden Courtyard of Hotel Healdsburg, a longtime festival sponsor. More than a singer, Austin is a composer, lyricist, and social activist with a degree from UC Berkeley School of Law. Debuting her Soul Sessions project, she combines swing, funk, and hip hop to reimagine classic songs associated with era-defining artists such as Roy Ayers, Ella Fitzgerald, Aretha Franklin, while also adding her original genrepushing songs into the mix. Accompanied by her quintet, which features Charles McNeal (alto and tenor saxophone); Glen Pearson (piano); Ron Belcher (bass); Leon Joyce (drums).

Austin possesses a storyteller's knack for compelling narrative, woven out of her deep knowledge of the jazz tradition and her command of blues, spirituals and contemporary soul. She's performed on bandstands internationally including at New York City's Birdland and Dizzy's Den, the SFJAZZ Center, and the Walt Disney Concert Hall in her native Los Angeles.

Late Concert with violinist Mads Tolling & The Mads Men, featuring vocalist Kenny Washington. Little Saint, Upstairs.

Two-time Grammy Award-winning violinist Mads Tolling celebrates the music of the 1960s with his Mads Men band, a supremely hip and versatile unit built on the world-class rhythm section tandem of bassist **Gary Brown** and drummer **Eric Garland**. They're joined by Grammy-nominated vocalist **Kenny Washington**, a jazz virtuoso who has earned



international acclaim with his soul-steeped sound and dexterous scatting. Born in Denmark and now living near Berkeley, Tolling is a masterly jazz artist who burst on the scene in 2003 while touring and recording with both Turtle

Master Stanley Clarke. Focusing on his solo career for the past 15 years, he's explored a vast array of jazz idioms, from the searing jazz/rock fusion of his Jean-Luc Ponty tribute to collective triumvirate of the San Francisco String Trio. The familiarity of the Mads Men repertoire hints at nostalgia, but the inventive arrangements put a decidedly contemporary spin on classic songs that defined the volatile era, from "Mission Impossible" and "The Good, The Bad & The Ugly" to "A Taste of Honey" and "Georgia on my Mind."

thursday 6/16 BOBI CÉSPEDES // ARENAS DANCE COMPANY



Since settling in the Bay Area as a teenager in 1969, Cubanborn vocalist Bobi Céspedes has found many different musical paths to share her extraordinary gifts. She first gained renown in the 1980s as the lead vocalist with Conjunto Céspedes, a band that introduced the Bay Area to the glorious sound of the foundational Afro-Cuban style known as son. She reached new audiences during her years touring with Grateful Dead drummer Mickey Hart's Planet Drum and Bembé Orisha projects, but since the release of her 2002 debut solo album Rezos on the renowned world music label Six Degrees Records she's established a commanding musical identity as a bandleader. An arresting performer with a deep, resonant voice who's also a master of the gourd chekeré, the Oaklandbased Céspedes embodies the music's sacred roots as a priestess in the Yoruba-derived Lucumí faith. Her fourth album, 2022's Mujer y Cantante, reflects her increasing confidence as a songwriter, focuses on her captivating originals in the son tradition. Sharing narratives about her family life and love, and the wisdom of Afro-Cuban fables for this special Healdsburg presentation, she's joined by her stellar seven-piece band featuring music director Marco Díaz on piano, trumpet and vocals, guitarist José Roberto Hernández, bassist Ernesto Mazar Kindelán, percussionists Julio Pérez and Javier Navarrette, and Lichi Fuentes on vocals, chekeré and güiro. No matter what the setting, Bobi's vibrant Cuban soul—her chambo—lights the stage.

thursday 6/16 BOBI CÉSPEDES: ARENAS DANCE COMPANY



Arenas Dance Company is an all-woman, Cuban dance and drum ensemble. This special Healdsburg presentation honors the resilience, strength, sensuality, and vibrancy of Cuban women: workers, sisters, grandmothers, neighbors, politicians, artists, and friends. The performance moves between Afro-Cuban folklore and popular dances to bring together the powerful spiritual and joyful aspects of *la mujer cubana*. The opening invocation draws from Lucumí, the Cuban religion based on Yoruba traditions carried west by enslaved West Africans. The evening continues by paying homage to female orishas (deities) and recognizing the different expressions of womanhood. The night accelerates to guaguancó, the rapid-fire rumba typically danced between couples. The dancers create polyrhythmic patterns with brooms. They celebrate work as spiritual practice.

LATE NIGHT NATALIE CRESSMAN & IAN FAQUINI



At first glance trombonist/vocalist Natalie Cressman and guitarist/vocalist lan Faquini make for an unlikely duo. But within a few seconds of hearing their lustrous harmonies and graceful interplay the magic of their chemistry is readily apparent. Built on their deep knowledge of the jazz and the Brazilian songbook-Faquini was born in the capital Brasilia and moved to Berkeley as an adolescent and Cressman hails from an illustrious musical clan known for collaborations with some of Brazil's greatest musicians-their musical partnership has earned international acclaim over the past five years. With a repertoire encompassing jazz standards, classics from the American and Brazilian songbooks, and their sophisticated original songs, the duo just released their second album Auburn Whisper, a manifestation of both their symbiotic musical partnership and resilience during unprecedented times. Written and recorded during the dark days of 2020, Auburn Whisper finds the two artists exploring a series of luxuriant soundscapes, reflecting on people and places they missed while discovering joy in the present moment.

HONORING CHARLIE & HENRI MUSSELWHITE DAY!



A bluesman to his bones, Mississippi-born Memphis-raised harmonica ace **Charlie Musselwhite** is a bona fide legend who soaked up Black music and culture first-hand from many of the tradition's most influential artists. Beyond the musical style, he absorbed the lifestyle. "It's an attitude," Musselwhite says of playing the blues. "A way of living life." Coming of age in the blues crucible of Chicago, he forged ties with foundational artists such as Muddy Waters, Junior Wells, Sonny Boy Williamson, Howlin' Wolf, Little Walter, and

particularly John Lee Hooker.

Over the course of his six-decade career, Musselwhite has released nearly 40 albums. Best known as a master harmonica player, he's also a seasoned, truth-telling vocalist, skilled songwriter rooted deep within the blues tradition, and a country blues guitarist of great depth, warmth and subtlety. Sonoma County residents for nearly 40 decades before

they relocated a few years ago, Charlie and his wife **Henri Musselwhite** were honored last year by Healdsburg Jazz for their years of service and dedication to the Wine Country community. He returns to town with a sensational band that includes veteran drummer **June Core**, bass guitarist **Randy Bermudes**, and guitarist **Chris "Kid" Andersen**.

"Henrietta and I lived in Sonoma County for nearly 40 years and loved it. Healdsburg and Geyserville were awfully nice to us, and we miss all the fine folks and good friends we have there. So many great memories! A piece of our hearts will always reside in Sonoma County. And to have received the recognition and award from the Healdsburg Jazz Festival is the icing on the cake. It means so much to us!"

OPENING ACT: TERRIE ODABI



Terrie Odabi's rapid ascendance as West Coast blues royalty was first declared by veteran blues historian Lee Hildebrand, who wrote in 2014 that the Oakland vocalist was "easily the most dynamic blues and soul woman to have emerged in the Bay Area since Etta James came out of San Francisco's Fillmore District in the '50s." Nominated three years in a row for the Blues Music Awards category "best soul blues female," Odabi possesses a rare combination of power and finesse. But it's the vivid shades of longing, ache, bliss, and passion she brings to the music that sets her apart from so many of her peers. Her abundant soul and improvisational prowess has made her a crucial contributor to today's blues scene. The Terrie Odabi group includes Kirk Crumpler-bass; D'Mardrums; Simon Russle-keyboards; Daniel Castro-guitar; and Terrie Odabi-vocals.

Oakland tenor saxophonist **Howard Wiley** returns to the Festival with his soul-charged, Hammond B-3-powered quartet, a tough, sinewy combo that blends jazz, gospel, and funk with state-of-the-art grooves. A commanding



improviser, Wiley has earned national renowned recording and performing with an array of heavyweights including Clarence "Gatemouth" Brown, Lauryn Hill, Jason Moran, and Hammond B-3 organ greats Chester Thompson and Doug Carn. His quartet features bassist **Marcus Phillips**, who's been touring recently with Jennifer Hudson,

drummer **Dante "Taz" Roberson**, and organist **LJ Holoman**, a sought after studio player with recording credits that include Mary J Blige, 50 Cent, Busta Rhymes, Nas, and The Game.

The City of San Francisco's 8th Poet Laureate, **Tongo Eisen-Martin**, brings his passion for social justice to the opening recital. A poet, movement worker, and educator, he was nominated for a California Book Award for his 2015 book of verse *Someone's Dead Already*. His latest curriculum on extrajudicial killing of Black people, "We Charge Genocide Again," has been used as an educational and organizing tool throughout the country. And his latest book, "Heaven Is All Goodbyes," published by the *City Lights Pocket Poets* series, was shortlisted for the Griffins Poetry Prize and won a California Book Award and an American Book Award.

saturday 6/18 DAVE HOLLAND SOLO & DUO & TRIO



Healdsburg Jazz Festival presents a very special concert showcasing multi-Grammy Award-winning bassist-composer **Dave Holland**, showcasing his commitment to creating consistently innovative music across a range of styles including solo bass, duo with guitarist **Kevin Eubanks**, and trio with fellow NEA Jazz Master pianist **Kenny Barron** and extraordinary drummer **Johnathan Blake**.

At 75, the Britain-born Holland stands as one of the most influential and transformative jazz artists of the past 50 years, universally esteemed for his tireless dedication to pursuing bold and innovative music that crosses genres. Experience the range of Holland's dynamic, innovative music and pioneering creative vision this evening at the Jackson Theater.

Holland first rose to prominence in groundbreaking groups led by Miles Davis, Stan Getz and Betty Carter. He remains a leader among the generation of artists whose innovations moved jazz bass from its swing and bop roots to embracing the vibrancy and multidisciplinary excitement of the post-Coltrane era. In the process Holland significantly extended the instrument's melodic, expressive range and utilized it to explore with confidence and clarity a wide range of musical genres in both the East Indian and American jazz traditions. This concert will provide the audience an opportunity to experience and celebrate the remarkable depth and breadth of Holland's work.



The evening will include Holland performing a bass solo, a format he embraced as far back as the EMC releases *Emerald Tears* (1977) and *Life Cycle* (1982) and as recently as a 2019 tour. The first set will include a reunion with **Kevin Eubanks**, the former "Tonight Show" bandleader with whom Holland has collaborated extensively in recent years, most notably on *Prism* (2013) with Craig Taborn (piano) and Eric Harland (drums).

The second part of the evening will be a trio set with fellow NEA Jazz Master **Kenny Barron** (piano) and **Johnathan Blake** (drums). Holland and Barron have recorded together several times, including *Scratch* (1985) and *The Art of Conversation* (2014), a mix of standards and original compositions awarded Record of the Year honors from the Jazz Journalists Association. Their most recent collaboration, *Without Deception* (2020), is an intimate and adventurous trio debut recording featuring masterful rhythmic drummer Johnathan Blake adding a deft rhythmic touch.

Born and raised in Philadelphia, Barron has been a creative force in jazz for six decades, since Dizzy Gillespie hired the 19-year-old pianist for his band with James Moody in 1962. Possessing a gorgeous touch and capacious melodic imagination, Barron is deeply versed in Brazilian music. A prolific composer responsible for at least half a dozen standards, he's released more than 50 albums as a leader and contributed to several hundred recordings as a sideman. His latest release, 2020's Without Deception, is a trio session with Holland and drummer Johnathan Blake. The son of renowned Philadelphia violinist John Blake Jr., he's become of jazz's most sought after drummer since making his recording debut in 1996, contributing to acclaimed recordings by the Mingus Big Band, Tom Harrell, Dr. Lonnie Smith, and of course Kenny Barron.



She spent 17 years performing regularly with trumpet great Clark Terry, with whom she accompanied distinguished guest artists such as Al Grey, Red Holloway, Jimmy Heath, Frank Wess, Marian McPartland, Dianne Reeves, Joe Williams and Lou Donaldson, to name a few. Now a deft bandleader in her own right, she plays a trio set of hard swinging blues-tinged modern jazz featuring **Dr. Joe Gilman** (piano) and **Essiet Okon Essiet** (bass) before her group hosts an exciting all-star jam session featuring musicians in town for the festival in the beautiful club atmosphere of the Spirit Bar located in the Hotel Healdsburg.


THE CURTIS FAMILY C-NOTES: GOSPEL, JAZZ, RHYTHM & BLUES

WILLIE JONES III QUINTET: MODERN JAZZ BLUES & SWING

Drummer, composer, producer Willie Jones III has been one of jazz's most recognized and celebrated drummers since the late 1990s. For his Healdsburg Jazz Festival 2022 performance, he's put together a program titled Our Man Higgins and has assembled an all-star group of musicians to pay homage to his mentor, the late, legendary drummer Billy Higgins. Growing up in Los Angeles, Jones not only studied with Higgins as a young musician, he recorded his first album on the drummer's World Stage label in 1990. Jones has proudly carried on Higgins' legacy through his work on the bandstand and in the studio as a record producer, running his own label called WJ3 Records. He's recorded and performed with a long list of artists including Arturo Sandoval, Roy Hargrove, Herbie Hancock, Wynton Marsalis, and Cedar Walton. With a talent-packed cast featuring Jeremy Pelt (trumpet), Ralph Moore (tenor sax), David Williams (bass), and Jeremy Manasia (piano), Our Man Higgins promises to deliver an enthralling, hard swinging set of both originals and re-imagined standards.

We close the Festival and celebrate Father's Day in true Wine Country style with San Francisco jazz vocal star **Paula West** at Truett Hurst Winery. The beautiful Dry Creek Valley, the biodynamic farm and grounds that produce Truett-Hurst's delicious wines, provide an idyllic setting for imbibing West's velvet-plush contralto. In a stunning outdoor setting, you'll experience her gift for weaving an eclectic array of songs into a cohesive jazz journey. With a repertoire encompassing American songbook standards and Johim, Bob Dylan and David Bowie, Lou Reed and Johnny Cash, West is a nonpareil song stylist who consistently leaves audiences dazzled and delighted. Performing with West: **Ed Cherry** (guitar), **Aaron Germain** (bass), **Adam Shulman** (piano), and others.

West has performed predominantly in leading jazz clubs and cabarets in San Francisco, New York and Los Angeles, with recurring engagements at the storied Oak Room of the Algonquin Hotel, Jazz at Lincoln Center, and Mezzrow in New York City as well as the SFJAZZ Center, Feinstein's at The Nikko, and Yoshi's in Oakland and San Francisco. Her Oak Room engagements earned her three straight New York Magazine Nightlife Awards as "Outstanding Female Jazz Vocalist." The New York Times has been particularly vocal in their praise for West, singling out her "thickly textured voice [that] has ripened into a driving expressive force." She has also performed at Lincoln Center with Wynton Marsalis, The White House, and Maison de la Musique in Paris. Whatever the setting, West displays her knack for creatively re-imagining standards and eagerness to identify worthy songs not usually found within the jazz/cabaret canon.
